Introduction:

This report consists detailed description of the programs and activities carried out throughout the year of 2021 starting January 2021 to December 2021 for its human transformation project.

Our Vision:

To Interrupt and eradicate human trafficking from Nepal

Our Mission:

To facilitate prevention, protection and empowerment programs for the potential and actual victims of human trafficking

Our Goal:

To save young girls and women from the risks of trafficking and help them build up their social, economic, emotional status and their rehabilitation in society

Project Background:

Nepal being a developing country is also considered among the tier 2 country in regard of human trafficking. As being a neighboring nation to India, it has a large area of open border to the country. Thus, it also opens doors to a lot of illegal activities that includes drugs and weapons smuggling as well as human trafficking being the most popular one among them. Thousands of young Nepali girls every year cross the Nepal India border through different

means and therefore possess the risk of being trafficked to the brothels of India and many other countries through the route of India.

In the year 2006 A.D Aashish Social Service was therefore established to combat human trafficking and save our Nepali daughters from being victims to this evil industry. Since then, it has been continuously working to achieve its goal and mission and have been rescuing Nepal's daughters.

Detailed description of the project:

1. Prevention work:

ASSN staffs at Butwal Bus Station have run its prevention program which included **Border Surveillance** and **awareness generating programs through** the distribution of Pamphlets and verbal awareness and counseling. The staffs at border performed the inquiry and surveillance throughout the bus stations, which is a route for hundreds of people to travel to India and domestically. This year we were able to benefit about 2500 people through awareness and counseling program. Similarly, about 128 people in total were intercepted from crossing the border, considered those at high risk of being trafficked.



2. Grace Shelter Home:

From the border and the community girls are referred to ASSN safe home “Grace Shelter Home”. The girls intercepted at the border considered at high or those who are rescued as victims if recognized in need of the safe home are transferred to Grace shelter for their recovery and safety. A total of **eight** girls were benefited by the safe home facility and then reunited to their society after receiving the safe home programs, like ***social leadership development trainings and Skill generating trainings.***



3. Skill development Training:

A total of 8 girls at the safe home received the Skill development training that included *Sewing-Cutting and Boutique training*. The training was successfully completed by teaching the girls to be able to sew a total of 28 items of clothes designs.



4. Social Leadership Development Training (SLDT):

The Social Leadership Development Training contained planned courses like Personality development, communication skills, Financial Management trainings, Spiritual growth, Law and its implementation. A total of 8 girls at the safe home received the SLDT that was intended to bring growth and recovery in the girls from victim to an empowered person and then reintegrate them to the society.

5. Covid-19 Relief programs:

A total of 80 families were provided with the covid relief packages during the misery of the Pandemic. The relief packs included items like rice, lentils, soyabeans, cooking oil, soap and sanitizers. This program benefitted mostly the people from the Slum of Butwal Tinau River as well as some others in nearby locality.

6. Staff Capacity Development Training:

A staff training was organized dated 2021 August 11 to 14, in which the staffs were trained on different subjects like fund raising, organization management and other important subjects. Facilitated by Mr. Ram Saran Poudel, the program was attended by about 20 ASSN Staffs.
